THE DIRECTOR

Jennifer Sarah Dean is a classically trained director based in Melbourne. She was fortunate enough to train at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre in London, and has enjoyed a varied career directing plays, musicals and events in both the United Kingdom and Australia.

Jennifer's other directorial credits include: *Night Mother* (Weston Studio Theatre, UK), *South Australia* (Lost Theatre, UK), *2084* codirecting with Jacob McCrory (Theatre Royal, Bath, UK), *Tape* (Courthouse), *The Haunting* (Athenaeum) and *Festen* (Ripponlea Estate). She has also directed a number of UK tours including: *A*

Christmas Carol, In the Loop, Pop up Panto and the Australian national tour of *Ghost Stories*. Jennifer is delighted to be working with Bloomsday in Melbourne again after directing the previous productions: *Holy Cow!* (2018) and *Travesties* (2019), at fortyfivedownstairs.

Johnathan returns to Bloomsday in Melbourne in a more digital capacity after performing as James Joyce in *Travesties* (2019) and in *Holy Cow!* (2018).

He studied at The National Theatre on a Cybec Foundation Scholarship, graduating with an Advanced Diploma of Stage and Screen Acting. He was also awarded the Graduate Actor position by the Red Stitch Ensemble in 2014. His film and TV credits include: *Spin Out* (directed by Tim Ferguson), *Lion* (Garth Davies), *Neighbours, Please Like Me* and *The Librarians*. In theatre, he has appeared in: *Richard 2nd* (Anərkē Shakespeare), *Festen* (Play Dead

Hunter is a graduate of the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA). Since graduating, he has combined acting, parenting, train driving and travel. He has been a guest performer on many TV shows, including being abducted by aliens in *Blue Heelers* and dissolved by intestinal acid juices in a mining 'planet' on *Farscape*.

In recent years, Paul has worked extensively in Shakespeare and classic texts for Eagles Nest Theatre Company, the Melbourne Shakespeare Company and the Australian Shakespeare Company, performing lead or multiple roles in open-air seasons and schools' incursions of

Bridget graduated from the National Theatre Drama School in 2016 and since then has predominantely worked in theatre. Her credits include: *Comedy of Errors, Twelfth Night, Much Ado About Nothing* (Melbourne Shakespeare Company), *Teaching and Learning* (Backyard Theatre

He was also seen on screen as Reginald Vole in Series Two of Shaun Micallef's *The Ex-PM* on the ABC.

ANNABELLE TUDOR – Molly Bloom



After completing her Bachelor of Arts (Acting) at Federation University Australia's Arts Academy in 2016, Annabelle returned to Melbourne where she made her professional debut with the Australian Shakespeare Company's (ASC) *Twelfth Night* in January 2017. Annabelle has since worked with the ASC numerous times, with highlights including playing First Witch and Lady Macduff in *Macbeth* (2018-19) and playing Guildenstern while frequently understudying Rosencrantz in *Hamlet* (2019-20). Outdoor Shakespeare productions quickly formed the foundation of Annabelle's developing career as she also started work for the Melbourne Shakespeare Company, having now played five of their recent seasons. Highlights include playing Beatrice in *Much Ado About Nothing* (2018) and Rosalind in *As You Like It* (2020), for which she was

also Assistant Director. Annabelle's commercial credits include playing Hannah in the Australian premiere of *Puffs*, in the Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane seasons.
